Philosophy Course Description: The course will present an introduction to the Montessori Method. It will cover the Montessori principles of child development and the educational methodology including instructional techniques and classroom procedures. The lectures will focus on the philosophical basis for the materials and methods. Montessori key concepts of absorbent mind, the universal tendencies, sensitive periods and the spiritual and moral development of the child provide the method's framework. The life of Maria Montessori and the history of the Montessori movement will be presented. The relationships between Montessori philosophy, the prepared environment, the adult and child will be examined. Her writings are the source for topics and the students will become familiar with her works, using them as references to develop a practical understanding of theory. The course lectures are supplemented with discussions from the required readings.

Observation Course Description: Observation skills are essential to the Montessori teacher. The Montessori Method is based on scientific observation. Montessori's principles for observation will be presented. The adult learner will receive a foundation in the relationship between the role of the adult, the prepared environment and observation. Observations methods and documentation techniques will be presented, discussed and analyzed throughout the practicum cycle. 24 hours are used as academic instruction. An additional 12 hours are completed independently by the adult learner in observation environments.

This area is the direct preparation for mathematics. Extensions and application of Montessori Sensorial materials to the environment are introduced.
